OXFORDSHIRE COUNTY COUNCIL (WITNEY, CORN STREET) (PROHIBITION OF WAITING) EXPERIMENTAL ORDER 2021

STATEMENT OF REASONS

Various proposals have been developed and prioritised across Witney as a result of funding received from the Department for Transports` Active Travel Emergency Fund. The proposals will aid active and healthy travel, which form part of the response to the COVID-19 Pandemic, and aim to 1) Make walking and cycling safer for everyone 2) make local shops, schools and employment easier to get to by walking and cycling, and 3) provide more choice for travelling in Witney.

The Experimental Traffic Regulation Order (ETRO) removes approx. 3 parking spaces on Corn Street outside Nos. 148-152 and the introduction of 'No Waiting at Any Time' (double yellow lines) parking prohibition to specifically to allow the continuity of the cycle lane though that section of carriageway.

The Experiment will be closely monitored during its operation and any comments/complaints that are received will be given due consideration with a view to deciding whether the experiment, or any part of it should become permanent.

The County Council continues its responsibility to consider the provision of convenient and safe movement of motor vehicles and other traffic, and the proposed measures are aimed at ensuring that ¹ danger is minimised whilst ² facilitating the effective and safe movement of traffic, ³ access to amenities, and ⁴ to improve air quality/reduce pollution.

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OXFORDSHIRE COUNTY COUNCIL (WITNEY, CORN STREET) (PROHIBITION OF WAITING) EXPERIMENTAL ORDER 2021

NOTICE is given that on 13th December 2021 Oxfordshire County Council made the above experimental order under the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984. The effect of this order, which comes into force on **24 December 2021** is to remove a 15-metre section of unrestricted parking on Corn Street outside Nos. 148-152, so as to create a continuous section of 'No Waiting at Any Time' (double yellow lines) to support promotion of 'Active Travel' measures.

The Experimental Order will remain in force for a maximum period of 18 months. If the provisions of this experimental Order are made permanent the measures will be incorporated into the Oxfordshire County Council (Various Roads - West Oxfordshire) (Prohibition and Restriction of Waiting and Permitted Parking) Order 2012 (as amended) which will be further amended accordingly.

This Order contains provisions allowing the Director for Communities/Environment and Place to modify or suspend the Order or any provisions of the Order (if appropriate) in accordance with Section 10(2) of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984.

The Council will be considering in due course whether the provisions of the experimental Order should be continued in force indefinitely. Any person may object to the making of an order for the purposes of such indefinite continuation within a period of 6 months:

- (a) beginning with the day on which the experimental Order comes into force (24 December) or
- (b) if that Order is varied by any order made by the Council or modified by the Director for Communities/Infrastructure Delivery of the Council pursuant to section 10(2) of the 1984 Act, beginning with the day on which the variation or modification comes into force.

If you wish to question the validity of the experimental Order or of any provision contained in it on the grounds that it is not within the powers conferred by the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984, or on grounds that any requirement of this Act or of any instrument made under it has not been complied with in relation to this Order, you may within 6 weeks from 13 December 2021 apply to the High Court for this purpose.

OXFORDSHIRE COUNTY COUNCIL (WITNEY, CORN STREET) (PROHIBITION OF WAITING) EXPERIMENTAL ORDER 2021

The Oxfordshire County Council ("the Council") in exercise of its powers under Section 9 of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984 ("the Act") and all other enabling powers and after consultation with the Chief Officer of Police in accordance with Part III of Schedule 9 to the Act, make the following Order.

- 1. This Order may be cited as the Oxfordshire County Council (Witney, Corn Street) (Prohibition of Waiting) Experimental Order 2021 and shall come into force on the 24th day of December 2021.
- (1) Any reference in this Order to any enactment (meaning any act and any subordinate legislation as defined in the Interpretation Act 1978) shall be construed as a reference to that enactment as amended or replaced by any subsequent enactment.
 - (2) The restrictions imposed by this Order shall be in addition to and not in derogation from any restriction or requirement imposed by any other enactment.
- The effect of this order and for the duration of this order is to remove a 15 metre section of `unrestricted parking` on Corn Street outside Nos.148-152, so as to create a continuous section of 'Prohibition of Waiting at Any Time'
- 4. Save as provided in article 5 of this order, no person shall cause or permit a motor vehicle to wait in the length of road specified in article 3.
- 5. Nothing in article 4 shall apply to a vehicle being used for any purposes specified in article 11 (general exemptions) or article 12 (exemptions for Disabled Persons Vehicles) within the Oxfordshire County Council (Various Roads West Oxfordshire) (Prohibition and Restriction of Waiting and Permitted Parking) Order 2012 (as amended).
- If the provisions of this Experimental Order are made permanent, the measures specified will be added by amendment to the Oxfordshire County Council (Various Roads - West Oxfordshire) (Prohibition and Restriction of Waiting and Permitted Parking) Order 2012 (as amended).
- 7. The Director for Communities / Environment and Place of the Council is empowered to modify or suspend this Order or any provision of it pursuant to and in accordance with Section 10(2) of the Act.
- 8. This Order shall continue in force for a maximum period of 18 months from the date on which it comes into force.

The building is covered by fire protection of alarms and smoke detectors. The main hall has front, side and rear emergency exits all fitted with strike bars. Emergency lighting is in place all around the building. We also have a full HD CCTV in operation covering all entrances and exits to the building. Annual gas safety check, main electrical check (once every 5 years); PAT testing (portable electrical appliance testing), up to date health & safety policy & risk assessments. Employers & public liability insurance in place; sufficient lighting internally & externally; regular fire checks & servicing of fire detection & extinguishing equipment; emergency procedures in place; designated smoking/non-smoking areas; good housekeeping procedures in place.

Since opening in 2018 we also have been running the "ask Angela campaign" with all bar staff trained to deal with this situation and posters up in th womens toilets explaining how we can help.

d) The prevention of public nuisance

All amplified music will be played indoors and kept to restricted decibel levels with doors & windows kept closed as much as possible.

Signage in place asking people to leave quietly.

e) The protection of children from harm

All staff will ensure that alcohol is not available to children and ID will be challenged where it is thought someone may be under age of 25, The recommended forms of ID that will be accepted are passports or driving licenses with a photograph. Suitable and sufficient sign-age advertising the "Challenge 25" policy will be displayed in prominent locations in the premises.

Each event / hire of the hall will be risk assessed to ensure that the individual event or reason for use is or is not suitable for anyone under the age of 18.

Films: no licence is required for 'not-for-profit' film exhibition held in community premises between 08.00 and 23.00 on any day provided that the audience does not exceed 500 and the organiser (a) gets consent to the screening from a person who is responsible for the premises; and (b) ensures that each such screening abides by age classification ratings.

Indoor sporting events: no licence is required for performances between 08.00 and 23.00 on any day, provided that the audience does not exceed 1000.

Boxing or Wrestling Entertainment: no licence is required for a contest, exhibition or display of Greco-Roman wrestling, or freestyle wrestling between 08.00 and 23.00 on any day, provided that the audience does not exceed 1000. Combined fighting sports –defined as a contest, exhibition or display which combines boxing or wrestling with one or more martial arts –are licensable as a boxing or wrestling entertainment rather than an indoor sporting event.

Live music: no licence permission is required for:

- o a performance of unamplified live music between 08.00 and 23.00 on any day, on any premises.
- o a performance of amplified live music between 08.00 and 23.00 on any day on premises authorised to sell alcohol for consumption on those premises, provided that the audience does not exceed 500.
- o a performance of amplified live music between 08.00 and 23.00 on any day, in a workplace that is not licensed to sell alcohol on those premises, provided that the audience does not exceed 500.
- o a performance of amplified live music between 08.00 and 23.00 on any day, in a church hall, village hall, community hall, or other similar community premises, that is not licensed by a premises licence to sell alcohol, provided that (a) the audience does not exceed 500, and (b) the organiser gets consent for the performance from a person who is responsible for the premises.
- a performance of amplified live music between 08.00 and 23.00 on any day, at the non-residential premises of (i) a local authority, or (ii) a school, or (iii) a hospital, provided that (a) the audience does not exceed 500, and (b) the organiser gets consent for the performance on the relevant premises from: (i) the local authority concerned, or (ii) the school or (iii) the health care provider for the hospital.

Recorded Music: no licence permission is required for:

- o any playing of recorded music between 08.00 and 23.00 on any day on premises authorised to sell alcohol for consumption on those premises, provided that the audience does not exceed 500.
- o any playing of recorded music between 08.00 and 23.00 on any day, in a church hall, village hall, community hall, or other similar community premises, that is not licensed by a premises licence to sell alcohol, provided that (a) the audience does not exceed 500, and (b) the organiser gets consent for the performance from a person who is responsible for the premises.
- o any playing of recorded music between 08.00 and 23.00 on any day, at the non-residential premises of (i) a local authority, or (ii) a school, or (iii) a hospital, provided that (a) the audience does not exceed 500, and (b) the organiser gets consent for the performance on the relevant premises from: (i) the local authority concerned, or (ii) the school proprietor or (iii) the health care provider for the hospital.

Dance: no licence is required for performances between 08.00 and 23.00 on any day, provided that the audience does not exceed 500. However, a performance which amounts to adult entertainment remains licensable.

Cross activity exemptions: no licence is required between 08.00 and 23.00 on any day, with no limit on audience size for:

- o any entertainment taking place on the premises of the local authority where the entertainment is provided by or on behalf of the local authority;
- o any entertainment taking place on the hospital premises of the health care provider where the entertainment is provided by or on behalf of the health care provider;
- o any entertainment taking place on the premises of the school where the entertainment is provided by or on behalf of the school proprietor; and


