b) The prevention of crime and disorder

(See above). These lock up premises, have their own internal and external CCTV. The CCTV installed is to the specifications and recommendations of Thames Valley Police. The CCTV images will be retained for thirty one days are downloaded on request. CCTV is also recording at all times the premises is open for licensable activity. CCTV times and dates are both visible and accurate. The premises is fully alarmed. The D.P.S, ensures that all staff involved in the sale of alcohol, have fully recorded and documented training, including six monthly refresher courses, in respect of their responsibilities under the Licensing Act 2003. This includes any changes of legislation and training in the usage and chronicled storage of CCTV. All training records are retained and available on site for inspection at any time.

c) Public safety

(See above). Also Internal and External CCTV. The premises has an approved fire alarm system installed and the commercial fire fighting equipment, has a maintenance contract. Both emergency lighting and smoke detectors are installed.

d) The prevention of public nuisance

(See above) Also, Internal and External CCTC etc.

External CCTV in particular, is a proven deterrent in terms of any anti- social activities, proxy sales, or public nuisance within the vicinity of the premises. The applicant, who is also the D.P.S. and his staff, will continue to vigilant in relation to any litter issues.

e) The protection of children from harm

(See above). Internal and External CCTC etc. The layout of the shop, continues to give consideration to preventing children's access to alcohol and as is now, all alcohol displayed, is not obstructed from the view of the sales assistants. The premises successfully operates a Challenge 25 'proof of age scheme policy'. A Sales Refusal and Incident book is fully maintained and available for inspection at any time. It is 'signed off ' weekly by the D.P.S. Non- alcoholic products, will continue to be situated away from the alcoholic display area.

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NOTES ON REGULATED ENTERTAINMENT

In terms of specific regulated entertainments please note that:

Plays: no licence is required for performances between 08:00 and 23.00 on any day, provided that the audience does not exceed 500.

Films: no licence is required for 'not-for-profit' film exhibition held in community premises between 08.00 and 23.00 on any day provided that the audience does not exceed 500 and the organiser (a) gets consent to the screening from a person who is responsible for the premises; and (b) ensures that each such screening abides by age classification ratings.

Indoor sporting events: no licence is required for performances between 08.00 and 23.00 on any day, provided that the audience does not exceed 1000.

Boxing or Wrestling Entertainment: no licence is required for a contest, exhibition or display of Greco-Roman wrestling, or freestyle wrestling between 08.00 and 23.00 on any day, provided that the audience does not exceed 1000. Combined fighting sports –defined as a contest, exhibition or display which combines boxing or wrestling with one or more martial arts –are licensable as a boxing or wrestling entertainment rather than an indoor sporting event.

Live music: no licence permission is required for:

- o a performance of unamplified live music between 08.00 and 23.00 on any day, on any premises.
- o a performance of amplified live music between 08.00 and 23.00 on any day on premises authorised to sell alcohol for consumption on those premises, provided that the audience does not exceed 500.
- o a performance of amplified live music between 08.00 and 23.00 on any day, in a workplace that is not licensed to sell alcohol on those premises, provided that the audience does not exceed 500.
- o a performance of amplified live music between 08.00 and 23.00 on any day, in a church hall, village hall, community hall, or other similar community premises, that is not licensed by a premises licence to sell alcohol, provided that (a) the audience does not exceed 500, and (b) the organiser gets consent for the performance from a person who is responsible for the premises.
- o a performance of amplified live music between 08.00 and 23.00 on any day, at the non-residential premises of (i) a local authority, or (ii) a school, or (iii) a hospital, provided that (a) the audience does not exceed 500, and (b) the organiser gets consent for the performance on the relevant premises from: (i) the local authority concerned, or (ii) the school or (iii) the health care provider for the hospital.

Recorded Music: no licence permission is required for:

- o any playing of recorded music between 08.00 and 23.00 on any day on premises authorised to sell alcohol for consumption on those premises, provided that the audience does not exceed 500.
- o any playing of recorded music between 08.00 and 23.00 on any day, in a church hall, village hall, community hall, or other similar community premises, that is not licensed by a premises licence to sell alcohol, provided that (a) the audience does not exceed 500, and (b) the organiser gets consent for the performance from a person who is responsible for the premises.
- o any playing of recorded music between 08.00 and 23.00 on any day, at the non-residential premises of (i) a local authority, or (ii) a school, or (iii) a hospital, provided that (a) the audience does not exceed 500, and (b) the organiser gets consent for the performance on the relevant premises from: (i) the local authority concerned, or (ii) the school proprietor or (iii) the health care provider for the hospital.

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Dance: no licence is required for performances between 08.00 and 23.00 on any day, provided that the audience does not exceed 500. However, a performance which amounts to adult entertainment remains licensable.

Cross activity exemptions: no licence is required between 08.00 and 23.00 on any day, with no limit on audience size for:

- o any entertainment taking place on the premises of the local authority where the entertainment is provided by or on behalf of the local authority;
- o any entertainment taking place on the hospital premises of the health care provider where the entertainment is provided by or on behalf of the health care provider;
- o any entertainment taking place on the premises of the school where the entertainment is provided by or on behalf of the school proprietor; and
- o any entertainment (excluding films and a boxing or wrestling entertainment) taking place at a travelling circus, provided that (a) it takes place within a moveable structure that accommodates the audience, and (b) that the travelling circus has not been located on the same site for more than 28 consecutive days.
