Background

In circa 2007/08 there was a Witney Town Centre Forum which was set up for the purposes of dealing with the closure of the Welch Way Car Park (which was), to make way for the building of Marriotts Walk Shopping Centre.

Given the fact that the High Street and Market Square is undergoing some major changes for delivery by Spring 2025, Officers from the District Council approached the Town Clerk with a view to reforming a forum in order to work collaboratively on various projects and events.

The purpose of the partnership will be to bring together representatives from the public, private and third sectors who have a common goal to help create a vibrant town centre where people want to live, work, shop and spend their leisure time.

Current Situation

The initial meeting of the Town Centre Partnership is scheduled for Tuesday 19th September and Emma Phillips, the District Council's Market Towns Officer has contacted various groups in order to start trying to establish the objectives of the group.

Members are therefore given this opportunity to feed back to the Town Clerk so that she can present these at the meeting.
