Title: Third Party Events Report

Background

The Council works hard to facilitate a range of third-party events which are primarily held on the Leys.

Current Situation

Current planned events for 2024:

- Hatwell's Funfair 13th 20th May: A yearly fairground event, aimed at younger children and families. This event is on a smaller scale than Witney Feast, but still a substantial event for the town.
- Witney Pride 25th May: Witney pride will be hosting their 3rd annual event in May 2024, celebrating the LGBTQ+ community. This event traditionally involves a procession through town, with local stalls set up on the leys.
- Witney Music Festival 7th & 8th June: As usual, the festival will take place on the leys in June. The Town Council has developed a close relationship with the festival over the last couple of years and we look forward to continuing to work with them.
- Witney Carnival Saturday 13th July: Witney Carnival returns in July 2024. This year's theme is Children's TV through the ages. The carnival is organised by Witney Round Table, Witney Lions Club, Witney Rotary Club and the Witney Air Cadets.
- Oxfordshire Play Association Thursday 1st August: Yearly free children's Play Day supported by WTC, held at different locations in town. This year it will be held at West Witney. The Sports and social club will be open for refreshments and toilet use.
- Witney Feast 9th & 10th September: A traditional event for the town that dates back as far as 1243! Wilsons Funfair will return this year.
- **Circus Ginnett: 30**th **September 6**th **October:** A popular touring circus event returning to the leys this year.

The venue and event staff are hoping to welcome back Oxford Playhouse outdoor theatre to the Leys again this year. The venue & event staff have been in discussion around the potential to collaborate with WODC to provide a more expansive and diverse calendar of events for the town in areas such as Market Square and Marriot's walk. This will be thoroughly researched and reported back to the Town Council.

Environmental impact
