Background

Burwell Hall and the Corn Exchange continued to operate throughout the Summer and are now welcoming back groups who primarily operate during term time.

Current Situation

Burwell Hall has continued to be busy during the Summer Holidays with many Birthday parties and Wedding anniversaries held with some hirers using the bar which is now staffed and operated by Witney Town Council. As the autumn begins, Burwell Hall can welcome back on average, two groups a day during the week and the same with parties at weekends.

At the Corn Exchange, the café in 1863 has been increasingly busy with a definite regular clientele as well as bringing new people through the door who have never been into the Hall before. The Venue and Events Officer has collaborated with his new assistant in bringing an open mic night as a regular evening boking, as well as looking to develop regular craft coffee mornings.

The Main Hall and Gallery Room have been busy with regular groups over the summer, with new regular bookings coming in from Diabetes Trust and Wild Oxfordshire. From September, the number of term-time groups will also increase as in line with Burwell Hall.

The Main Hall has hosted the Full Monty by Buttercross Theatre Productions with sell out numbers over the four performances. 1863 was opened and maximised potential sales for this event. The focus now turns to their Christmas Panto rehearsals for Aladdin.

There has been interest from individuals who are wanting to display on the walls in the café and have asked if there is a procedure to do this. So far, the Venue and Events Officer has been approached by local artists and local photographers wanting to display and feels that a dedicated system of hire/rental of the space would be beneficial and fair to all. This could be free rental on a rolling month basis, or it could be a hire fee as in other areas of the hall.

The current usage figures, compiled by the Bookings Administrator, are attached for information.
