Current Situation

Six applications were received for this fund and were presented to the Stronger Communities Committee for consideration on Monday 26 September 2022, this committee having the background knowledge and understanding concerning Witney's youth services.

Following presentations from some of the applicants at the meeting, and following consideration of application forms and supporting documents, the recommendation of the committee was to defer a decision to Policy, Governance & Finance.

The applications were all good on various criteria and offered value for the Council in varying improvement and continuation of youth provision across Witney. However, the total amount was £63,500.00 over the agreed budget so further examination of the applications, their benefit to Witney residents and supporting financial documents would be required.
